current roof repairs this is perfect timing. Thank you.

Leeds Cathedral Day of Reconciliation is on Tuesday 17 December 7am – 7pm. There will priests available to hear confessions along with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament all day.

First Holy Communion: There will be a parent meeting on Tuesday 3rd December at 7pm. Children need to be in Year 4 and above. In addition, your child must have completed their first confession (sacrament of reconciliation) in order to be enrolled on the course. Attendance at this meeting is essential.
