Scaffolding: Whilst slow, I am delighted to report we are making progress! The repairs to the roof over the Baptistry, back of the Sanctuary and the entrance to the Theatre are now complete and we can move on to addressing the terrible damp in the Lady Chapel. Obviously all works to a listed church building have to be co-ordinated with the Diocese of Leeds and we should have now received the authority for the next stage. This does of course mean the scaffolding will have to remain for another few weeks. We fully appreciate how difficult this makes access to the Parish Centre and are doing everything possible to get work completed. This is a very expensive process and any donations to the restoration fund would be greatly appreciated.

Urgent Parking Update: Scaffolding has now been erected at the rear of the Presbytery to begin repairs to the roof. Hopefully this will be completed within a week or so. There is therefore ABSOLUTELY NO PARKING in the small car park – there is literally only enough space for the clergy and the 2 rented spaces.
