Christmas Mass Times: To enable Parishioners to plan ahead, vigil Masses will be at St Austin's at 5pm and at St Ignatius at 5:30pm, both preceded by carols. There will then be Mass at St Austin's at 11pm, again preceded by carols from 10:15pm. On Christmas Day, Holy Mass will be celebrated at English Martyrs at 9:30am, St Ignatius at 10am and St Austin's at 10:30am.

Roof Repairs: Scaffolding has once again been erected at the front of church to address the leaks in the church roof near the Lady Chapel. Hopefully these repairs will be completed quickly and the scaffolding removed in time for Christmas. As with all repairs of this scale; and with St Austin's being a Grade II listed building, the work is expensive and any donations to the restoration fund would be greatly appreciated. We must make sure our historic church is watertight before we progress plans for refurbishment for our bicentenary.
